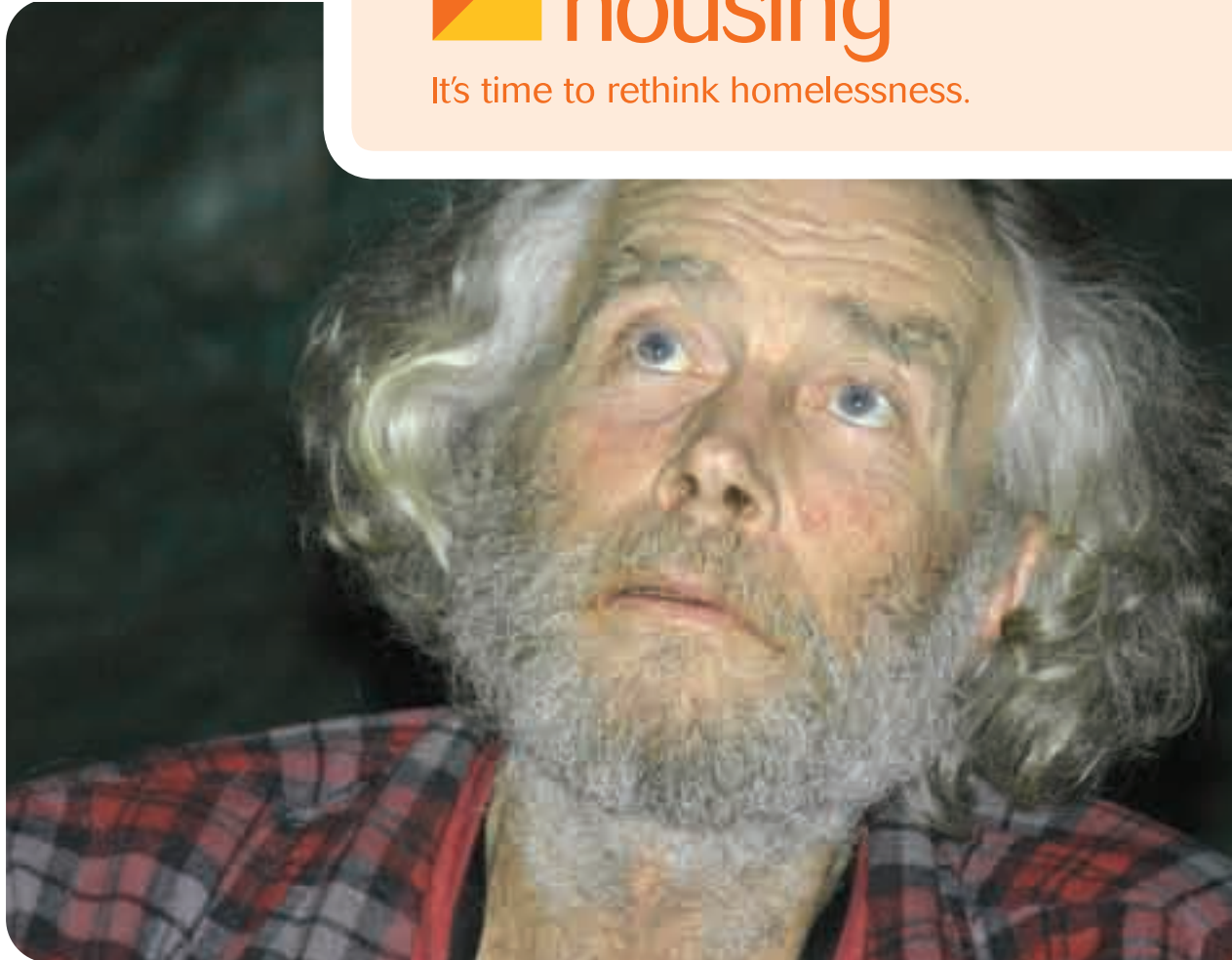

2011 ANNUAL REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY

We are very pleased to present our fiscal year 2011 annual report to the community. This past year we have been privileged to work with over 1,100 individuals – single adults and families – who were facing the reality of homelessness here in our northern Virginia community, one of the most affluent regions of our nation. With the help and support of individuals, community groups, businesses, government agencies, and faith communities, we have had the joy of seeing many we serve succeed in changing their lives, building a better future for themselves and a stronger community for all of us.

Some of the highlights and accomplishments of our work together in fiscal year 2011 included:

- Served over 1,100 individuals, including 238 children, in one or more of our programs.
- Provided over 64,000 “bednights” of shelter through seven shelter programs.
- Served 26 families and 59 single adults through our post-shelter transitional and supportive housing programs.
- Assisted 22 families and 62 single adults to move into permanent housing in the community; and assisted an additional 20 households to move from shelter into transitional housing
- Education & Employment Resource Center assisted several hundred residents in one or more of its services, including:
 - 212 assisted in job search
 - 132 participated in a job readiness program
 - 103 obtained new employment with average monthly wage of \$1,730
 - 40 participated in nurturing parenting classes
 - 152 participated in financial planning classes
 - 32 participated in housing readiness classes
 - 23 persons successfully completed the Out of Poverty program
- Selected by the City of Alexandria to operate the Alexandria Community Shelter – beginning October 1, 2010 – serving 44 single adults and 6 to 10 families nightly.
- Received the help of hundreds of volunteers who provided over 15,000 documented hours of volunteer service
- Joined with 8 other nonprofit agencies as the Bridging to Affordability Collaborative which was awarded a Fairfax County contract to implement a 3-year local rent subsidy program helping households who are homeless or on housing wait lists to move to stable housing.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

SHELTER PROGRAMS

New Hope Housing's seven emergency shelter programs in FY2011 provided 179 shelter beds year-round plus an added 47 beds during winter months. These programs provided more than 60,000 "bednights" of shelter for families and single adults who were homeless in our community.

Shelter programs provide safe, clean and welcoming housing with nutritious meals as well as support services. These services assist residents to return rapidly to appropriate, affordable housing in the community. Services continue for one year to help them maintain their housing and thrive. Funding for the shelter programs is provided primarily by local jurisdictions with supplemental funding raised from the community.



Mondloch House I

Shelter for 8 adults who have been chronically homeless and have significant mental health needs. MHI uses a "housing first" approach, seeking to build trust and engagement so that residents will cooperate in seeking mental health assessment and treatment. Primary funding is provided by Fairfax County.

Mondloch House II

A 45-bed family shelter serving up to 18 families, with a children's services program along with other shelter services. Primary funding is provided by Fairfax County.

At the close of FY2011, New Hope Housing was preparing to launch a new family shelter program using multiple apartment units for families needing shelter services, rather than congregate living in a shelter building. The new program will provide greater privacy and independence for the families being served.

Eleanor U. Kennedy Shelter

A 50-bed shelter for 38 men and 12 women, located in an historic building on Fort Belvoir grounds; named in honor of Eleanor U. Kennedy, a community leader who spearheaded the founding of New Hope Housing. The primary funding is provided by Fairfax County.

Emergency Overflow Unit at the Kennedy Shelter

An emergency, walk-in shelter operating from 4:00 pm to 7:00 am daily, the Overflow Unit is in a separate facility on the grounds of the Kennedy Shelter. It serves 11 adults, with an added 10 beds provided in the main building in winter.

Alexandria Community Shelter

A 65-bed shelter in the City of Alexandria serving 44 single adults and 6 to 10 families, with a full array of services to assist residents. Primary funding provided by the City of Alexandria.

Ventures in Community

Hypothermia Outreach Program (VIC-HOP)

A 25-bed winter shelter program, located at Rising Hope United Methodist Mission Church, coordinated by New Hope Housing with Fairfax County support, and staffed primarily through volunteers from Ventures in Community—an ecumenical group of faith communities in the Lee and Mt. Vernon areas.

Falls Church Homeless Shelter

A winter shelter in the City of Falls Church serving 12 adults. This shelter program is supported by the Friends of Falls Church Homeless Shelter.

SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAMS

Supportive housing provides long-term housing with ongoing services for individuals or families with disabilities who, without this opportunity for subsidized housing with supports, would likely be unable to obtain or maintain permanent housing. Funding for these programs comes from federal HUD grants, local jurisdictions, and added support raised from the community. Residents also pay rent, which may not exceed 30% of income.

Milestones & RISE

Long-term supportive housing for families in which an adult member has a significant mental health or cognitive disability. Ongoing case management and children's services are provided to support the families. Together Milestones and RISE now provide housing and services for 14 families.

Max's Place & Susan's Place

These programs provide permanent supportive housing for single adults who have serious and persistent mental health challenges, previously lived unsheltered, and resisted services. Max's Place is the first and only "safe haven" program in Fairfax County, started by New Hope Housing in 1998. In 2008, New Hope Housing began operating Susan's Place, an established program and, the agency's first program in Arlington County. Together the programs provide housing for 12 residents.

The programs use a "housing first" approach, emphasizing getting individuals off the streets and into safe housing. Over time staff work to build trust and engagement so that residents will link to services such as health care, mental health, and disability services. On-site staffing is provided 24/7.

The Housing First Apartments Program

Provides scattered site apartments for 17 previously chronically homeless adults. New Hope Housing

leases or owns the units for the program; identifies and places residents; provides drop-in visits to support the stability of residents in their apartments; and provides linkages to needed services in the community. The Fairfax County Consolidated Community Funding Pool and other Fairfax County funds support the program.

Just Home

A similar housing first apartments program in Arlington County, serving 3 chronically homeless women in 3 housing units.

Gartlan House

Provides permanent supportive housing for 8 chronically homeless adult men. The program serves residents able to function well with staff on-site presence only 8 hours daily. Gartlan House is named for Virginia State Senator Joseph V. Gartlan, Jr., who was a forceful advocate for the needs of disabled and homeless persons throughout his life.





TRANSITIONAL HOUSING PROGRAMS

Transitional housing programs provide up to 24 month housing in units in the community, currently 8 units for families and one unit serving four single men. Participants are involved in education programs and/or employed for 30 hours per week, and continue to receive case management and other services to prepare for permanent housing stability.

Transitional housing programs include Stepping Out I & II; Project STRIDE (Success Through Responsibility, Initiative, Determination and Enjoyment); and Turning Point. The programs are funded by grants/contracts with Fairfax County, Christian Relief Services, and HUD, supplemented by private funds raised from the community.



The Partnership for Permanent Housing

A pilot program to assist families in moving from homelessness to homeownership. A collaboration among three nonprofit agencies and Fairfax County, which funds the program, PPH offers long-term support for 25 families working toward homeownership over five years. New Hope Housing provides case management services for 13 families in the program.

SUPPORT SERVICES AND OUTREACH PROGRAMS

In line with our mission to provide not only shelter but also the tools to build a better life, the core of New Hope Housing services for residents is built around education, employment, debt reduction, and life skills as the means to obtain and maintain housing. Residents work with a case manager to develop an Individual Service Plan designed to address first the resident's immediate crisis needs and then to outline steps toward permanent housing. New Hope Housing's case management teams include a housing specialist, who assists in locating affordable appropriate housing and serves as a liaison and negotiator with landlords.

In addition to rapid re-housing, residents are provided alcohol/drug services, mental health assistance; medical/dental services; educational assessment, counseling and placement; life skills classes; recreational, social and cultural programming; employment assessment, counseling, placement in job skills training, job search and job placement help; and a children's services program. Referral to public services in the community, programs through local public schools, and cooperative arrangements with other nonprofit agencies working both on-site at New Hope Housing locations and in the community, are used extensively.

Education & Employment Resource Center (EERC)

The Education & Employment Resource Center (EERC) goals are to assist residents in assessing education and work experience and aspirations, setting education and employment goals, strengthening educational background, identifying employment interests and opportunities, developing/strengthening job skills, preparing to seek employment, and attaining employment at a livable wage with benefits. Services are provided by EERC staff and volunteers, and through extensive working relationships with community education, training and job development programs.

The EERC also directs one of New Hope Housing's foundational programs, Out of Poverty (OOP). Developed by an educator and a social worker, the structured 18-session curriculum fosters the mental, emotional and behavioral changes needed to intervene in the poverty cycle and build a different future. The program uses a group process and helps each individual to accept his/her life experiences, build a vision of a new future, and develop a plan for achieving that new future. OOP lessons include self-management, work relevant values and self-determination, and tools such as action planning, mental rehearsal, understanding personal responsibility, and the keys to negotiating differences.

Children's Services Program

New Hope Housing's Children's Services Program ensures that special attention is given to the needs of children in the families served at New Hope Housing by providing child and family case management, school liaison assistance, tutoring programs, cultural and recreational activities, and assistance in identifying and accessing other community services.

Homeless Prevention & Rapid Re-Housing (HPRP)

As part of the Fairfax-Falls Church 10 Year Plan to Prevent and End Homelessness, a coordinated service delivery team, called HOST (Housing Opportunities Support Team), works to identify persons at risk of homelessness and to intervene to prevent homelessness or divert persons from shelters. In FY2011 New Hope Housing's team provided emergency financial assistance to 89 households along with ongoing case management and education, employment and housing assistance. The program is funded by Fairfax County.



Mobile Medical Outreach

Mobile Medical Outreach teams serve the health care needs of persons living unsheltered in Fairfax County. The team includes a Fairfax County Public Health psychiatric nurse practitioner, a Community Services Board mental health outreach worker, and New Hope Housing outreach worker. The goal of the program is to link unsheltered homeless persons to medical, dental and other services in the community, thereby reducing the expensive use of emergency services for more routine needs, and improving the health of those served. The program is funded by Fairfax County.

SPECIAL EVENTS

GALA DE MAYO

Over 270 guests reveled in the South-of-the-Border festivities at Gala de Mayo in May. This annual benefit featured mariachi music, dining, dancing and live and silent auctions. Platinum Sponsors Greg Garcia and Phil and Peg Soucy, and Gold Partners Clayton and Sandy Davis, Cityline Partners, Freddie Mac, Modern Technology Solutions, Inc. and Science Applications International Corp., helped make the gala a great success which raised over \$140,000 in support for New Hope Housing. The highlight of the evening was a live auction that featured a California travel package plus a walk-on role on the hit FOX-TV comedy series Raising Hope. This one-of-a-kind experience was made possible by Raising Hope producer Greg Garcia.

PLANTING SEEDS OF HOPE VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION

Using a botanical theme of growth, in May New Hope Housing acknowledged the generous support it receives from hundreds of volunteers at its volunteer recognition program, Planting Seeds of Hope. Individuals, families, community groups and businesses were all recognized for their much needed and appreciated services. Among more than a dozen individuals and groups given special recognition, Linda Hill received the Jim Lund Award for exceptional length of service, Girl Scout Troop #479 and leader Carylin Waterval received the Allie McConnell Youth Service Award, and Andrea Grimaldi was recognized as our Volunteer of the Year. Many thanks to all our volunteers who support our programs and services.

HELP THE HOMELESS WALKATHON

With the help of over 3,000 walkers, several corporate sponsors, and hundreds of donors, New Hope Housing received \$147,320 from the 2010 Fannie Mae Help the Homeless Walkathon to support our programs and services. The Help the Homeless Walkathon is the largest event in the Washington region focused on both building community awareness of homelessness and raising funds in support of agencies providing homeless services. Many thanks to all of the individuals, community groups, faith communities, schools and businesses who participated in the Walkathon in support of New Hope Housing!
